

BEST BALL SCRAMBLE RULES

We are playing best ball with the following modifications, otherwise per USGA Rules:

1. **SCORE CARDS:** Make Card out as follows:
 - a. TOP LINE – TEAM NUMBER, FOLLOWED BY THE HOLE SCORES AND TOTALSCORE.
 - b. ADD GOLFER NAMES BELOW THE TOP LINE. Indicate who took the Drive at each hole position with an “X”.
 - c. Make sure you add and post the total number of strokes for the Round. Each score card must show the actual number of strokes for each hole. Use of a Plus (+) or Minus (-) for deviations from par will not be accepted.
 - d. You do not have to record a “threesome’s” rotational player on the scorecard. **(See below)**
 - e. Score cards are to be turned into Dennis Palmese, or Bob Lear.
2. **THE BALL MUST BE HOLED AND ALL STROKES COUNTED AND RECORDED ON SCORECARD.**
3. **FINAL SCORE:** The final score will be determined by subtracting the team handicap from the team’s total score for the Round. Dennis P. – will make this calculation and post the winner.
4. **DRIVE - FOURSOME:** Each golfer must use two drives on the front nine and two drives on the back nine. The remaining drive in the front and back nine can be anyone's drive.
5. **DRIVE - THREESOME:** Each golfer needs to use three drives on the front and three drives on the back nine.
 - a. **THREESOME DESIGNATED ROTATION GOLFER - TWO STROKE RULE:** Simulates a Fourth golfer:
 - b. For each hole, and on a rotational basis, one golfer will be designated to take two strokes at each ball position including at the Tee. (See Rotation Order)
 - c. Except for the assigned rotational golfer, no other golfer may take a second stroke at any hole.
 - d. If either of the assigned golfer’s two Tee drives is selected as best ball, he will be recorded as the Driver at that hole.
 - e. If the assigned golfer has had his required three Tee Drives, the assigned golfer will NOT take any drives off the Tee, but will continue to take two strokes at each ball position, until the ball is holed.
 - f. Rotation Order: The listing of the golfers on the score card determines the rotation order for the golfer assigned to take the extra stroke at each hole. You’re free to select which golfer on the card starts the rotation at the start of the round. This rotation continues without change until the end of the Round. You do not have to record the rotational player on the scorecard
